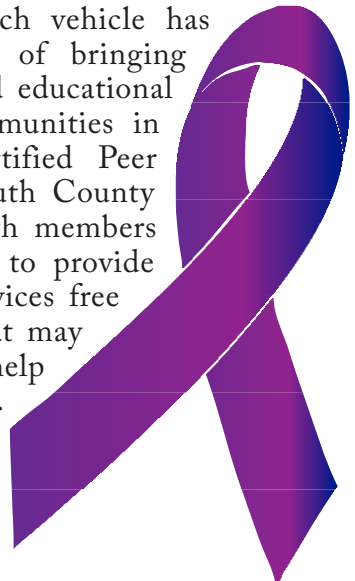

IME 844-276-2777 The program is designed to assure effective access to treatment for New Jersey residents who seek treatment for their substance use disorder (SUD). An individual who calls the program's toll-free number, 844-276-2777 for a referral to treatment will be provided with assistance and support on a 24/7/365 basis.

SUICIDE HOTLINE # 9-8-8 To reach the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. It will provide easy access to crisis services for people with mental health and substance use issues and help reduce the stigma surrounding these conditions. The goal of 9-8-8 is to have 24/7 crisis call centers (someone to talk to), mobile crisis teams (someone to respond to crises), and crisis stabilization programs (somewhere to go).

CRISIS TEXT LINE: TEXT START TO 741-741 Crisis Text Line is free, 24/7 support for those in crisis. Text from anywhere in the USA to text with a trained Crisis Counselor.
