SMART DRIVING STRATEGIES

- Check and double check blind spots

- Driving while fatigued
- Distractions
- Do not text while driving

CONTINUED SAFE DRIVING

- Obey all traffic signs and devices
- Use caution at all intersections
- Use your mirrors and check blind spots
- Use caution in reverse
- Never let the gas gauge go below 1/4 tank

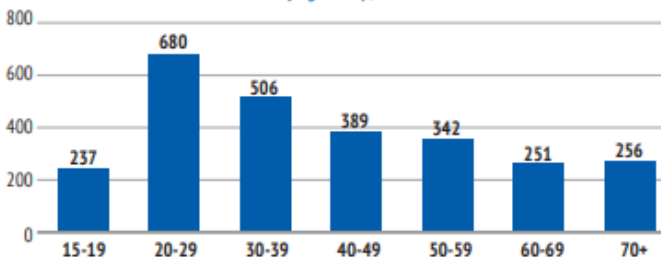
NUMBER OF PEOPLE KILLED BY DISTRACTED DRIVING IN 2019
