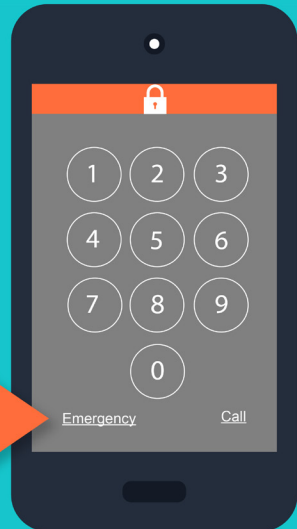

SEEK 9-1-1

The Monmouth County Sheriff's Office implemented its 9-1-1 communications center in 1992 and currently answers calls for 48 municipalities and NWS Earle. The 9-1-1 center also dispatches police for 25 towns, 80 fire departments and 30 first aid departments. Last year alone, the communications center answered 775,000 calls of which 699,000 were emergency calls.

All smart phones will enable you to **DIAL 9-1-1** even if the phone is locked and you do not know the code.

Look for the **EMERGENCY CALL** button on the screen.



- This program, created for 1st and 2nd graders, will cover when to call 9-1-1, in what situations to call 9-1-1, and how to call 9-1-1.
- A short video will give an overview of how 9-1-1 works and then demonstrations of scenarios will be role played by students so they can see the correct way in which to handle an emergency situation.
- Finally, a 9-1-1 Coloring book will be given to each student to complete as a review of the program.
- Our goal for this program is to help young students feel comfortable, confident, and knowledgeable about calling 9-1-1 in an emergency situation.

Did you know that you can text 9-1-1 in an emergency if it is too dangerous to talk?
